~Coopers Craft: "The Barrels Make The Bourbon That's Why We Make The Barrels":
\$17 a dram

This is a product from Brown-Forman Cooperage in Louisville Kentucky. Yes, you heard it right, Cooperage. They make their own barrels and whiskey, coined the term "Coppering". They note that, coopering is a highly skilled tradecraft, passed down from one generation of master coopers to the next. This is because they say, "the barrel contributed over 50% of their bourbon's flavor and 100% of its color, making quality barrels- what coopers call "raising"."

This 100 proof whiskey is wonderful, in my opinion palates like 90 proof. Very smooth.

The Nose: Fresh hewn oak with hints of smoke and char are spiced with hints of cinnamon and leather atop a layer of orchard and citrus fruit. Sweetened with a sprinkling of vanilla wafer crumbs.

The Taste: Carmel and cotton candy coat fresh apple, pear and citrus fruit atop vanilla wafers dusted with sharp cinnamon.

~Rogue Spirits: Single Barrel Project, Single Malt Whiskey:
\$26 a dram

This whiskey is from our friends in Newport Oregon. Rogue has been distilling now for over 10 years and produces some very fine whiskey. This one is a "Single Malt", very exciting having such a fine single malt right in our backyard!

This beautiful single malt comes in at 92 proof, smooth with a very nice hint of cherry in the finish. If you haven't tried this, I would highly recommend checking out the distillery side of Rogue while chatting it up with the local sealions.
