Our Cultural Heritage

Colombo Club Events in January throughout the Years

In January 1923, it was decided that members' children would be admitted free of charge to the dinners and dancing until they reached the age of 16, but they were not allowed on the dance floor if the ballroom was full.

In January 11, 1949, the club held a cioppino banquet. The cost was \$1 per person. A large number of members and wives of the members attended the event. When the banquet came to an end, "armoniose melodie" (harmonious melodies) were played by accordion player Mike Giacobetto. The evening reached its climax when the well-known soprano Antoinette Bottana, among great applause, sang soft arias of Italian composition. The evening ended with toasts and cheers for head chef Mike Roggero for making the cioppino.

January 1954, Mario Lovisone made several changes to club policies. The first was to hold the Board meetings in English. Members who still wanted to speak Piemontese at the meetings were allowed to do so. It was decided at the meeting that no politician would be allowed to speak at the club about political issues, but they were allowed to attend events as guests. The Board also decided that they would give out cigars to each of the members at the birthday dinners. It was at this time that a decision was made to hang pictures of all past presidents on the walls in the club room.

On January 9, 1958, the club held a special sports night to honor local baseball great, Cookie Lavagetto. Rocky Marciano, who was in Oakland to referee a local wrestling match at the Oakland Auditorium, decided to attend the event. Eddie Basso remembered that Ernie Lombardi, one of the greatest

baseball players of all time, was also at that dinner. Ernie's wife had just passed away, and he was in a deep depression. Word started getting around that Ernie Lombardi was at the club and when it reached Marciano, Rocky jumped up from his chair and rushed over to Lombardi and kissed him and said, "You are my hero!" It seems that Rocky had grown up watching Lombardi play catcher for the Boston Braves. Ed Basso said, "That night Ernie Lombardi came out of his depression. It was such a great night."

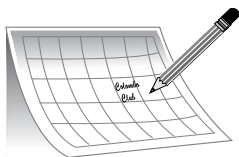
The retired and undefeated heavyweight boxing hall of fame champion Rocky Marciano was again in the Bay Area in 1969, and this time the Board voted to pay him \$500 to attend a sports night benefit dinner. It took place at the annual sports night on January 24, 1969.

In January 1998, the club dues were raised to \$75 per year.

In January of 2009, the club updated the reservation procedures and started a new policy to charge members \$10 for each no-show at dinners.

In January 2015, the price for members and non-members at the birthday dinners were increased by \$4 to adjust for the minimum wage rate in the city of Oakland.

Starting in January 2022, only credit cards and checks were accepted payments for dinners at the ticket booth. Also, for the first time, members were now able to pay their yearly dues with a credit card online through the Colombo Club's website.

And as they step away, so many can't resist one last look back and a final wave before heading down to the main hall to unwrap their gift.



It's equally fun to watch the parents and grandparents—phones up, cameras clicking—capturing every second. Later, seeing families gather around the Christmas tree or in Santa's sleigh for a group photo is a reminder that this night isn't just about presents; it's about memories.

As I reflect on the years I brought my own three children to this celebration, I can't help but smile. I'm grateful to be part of a Club that protects traditions like this—and keeps them strong, year after year. Thank you to the Colombo Club and Women's Auxiliary for continuing to give our families a Christmas event that's truly meaningful, joyful, and unforgettable.

Because this party has so many moving parts, it's impossible to name everyone without accidentally leaving someone out—but I do want to recognize a few who were especially helpful: Marc Emeldi, Denise Picetti, Tony Tedeschi, Mark Rezente, Don Ceremello, and Dianne Marangio.
