and featured the "nine old men." In attendance from the Oaks were club owner "Brick" Law, Casey Stengel, Ernie Lombardi, Jim Tobin and Billy Raimondi. The Oakland Tribune described the event as "a most rollicking" affair. Sports cartoonist for the Oakland Tribune, Lee Susman, known for his weekly cartoons in the sports page, was also honored at one of the sports nights. At the October 1960 sports night, the club honored local St. Louis Cardinals' pitcher Ernie Broglio after his 21-win season (see photo on back page).

1962 president, John Gai, a fireman for the city of Oakland and presided over a dinner for 49er and Colombo Club member, Leo Nomellini attracted 661 people. In attendance were Coach Red Hickey, 49er President Vic Moribito, 49er place kicker Gordy Soltau and Mayors George Christopher and Jack Houlihan. John Gai organized many popular road trips that included Las Vegas, Raider and Giant games, ice hockey games, and wineries.

Aldo Galletti, son of charter member and third president of the club Luigi Galletti, served as president from 1963 to 1964. Like his father, Aldo was instrumental in planning and attending many of the golf outings. Aldo was so good at golf that he participated in and won several California State Golf Championships. He was behind a movement to turn the bocce room (Isabella Room) into an indoor golf driving range. To promote the idea, he organized a golf clinic put on by a dozen local golf professionals, including Mark Frye, Dewey Longworth, Bill Corbett, Joe Mozel and Pat Markovich.

President Paul Boasso, honored at the annual Sports Night dinner in 1963, were baseball great Jackie Jensen and all of the Oakland Raiders. There was a jack rabbit hunting trip outing to Tracy. Members had to bring their own shotguns (no other fire arms were allowed), and there was to be no drinking until after the shoot. The club held the first annual ".22 Shoot" in the bocce alleys in the Isabella Room. The cost of the entry and dinner was \$2. Each contestant paid 25 cents for five shots. The winner won a cup and a turkey. Second place got just the turkey, and third place won a goose. Fourth place won a chicken. The booby prize was a squab.

During the 50s and 60s the Colombo Club hosted professional athletes at the dinners. President Chris Revelli, a tire shop owner, invited many athletes, sons of Italian immigrants, to stop at the club to socialize and enjoy traditional Italian wine and food, fellowship and camaraderie. Among the athletes were Billy Martin. Ernie Lombardi of the Cincinnati Reds, Harry "Cookie" Lavagetto of the Washington Senators and Dodgers and Rocky Marciano.


Joe DiMaggio also visited the club that night. When DiMaggio came into the club, he showed up after everyone had already gone downstairs. Ed Basso recalled, "Joe walked in the club and the only people in the room were the bartenders. Joe said, 'What gives, no one is here?' He was then escorted downstairs where there were 650 guys in the dining room waiting for him."

Ray Fratangelo recalled that when they saw Joe enter the room, there was dead silence followed by loud cheers. Joe said, "This is my kind of party."

and Leo Nomellini; Raiders, Fred Biletnikoff, Al Davis and John Vella; Billy Raimondi, catcher for the Oaks; and Dario Lodigiani, who played for the Oakland Oaks, Philadelphia Athletics and Chicago White Sox.

In 1959, the club hosted a reunion for the 1948 Pacific Coast Champion Oakland Oaks baseball team to a sold out crowd. Aldo Galletti reported that the club could have sold 1,200 tickets to this event if they had had the room. As it was, 700 people attended the sold out event. The team was managed by Casey Stengel
